STRATEGY AND OBJECTIVES

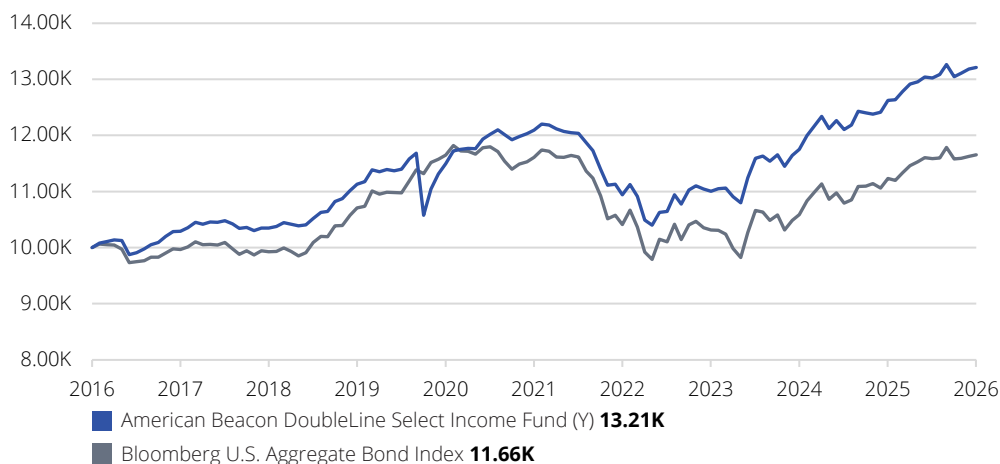
- **Attractive Yield:** The Fund endeavors to achieve a strong yield and a low duration.

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For each fund with at least a three-year history, Morningstar calculates a Morningstar Rating™ based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a fund's monthly performance (including the effects of sales charges, loads and redemption fees), placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of funds in each category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. (Each share class is counted as a fraction of one fund within the scale and rated separately, which may cause slight variations in the distribution percentages.) The Overall Morningstar Rating for a fund is derived from a weighted average of performance figures associated with its three-, five- and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. In the U.S.-domiciled Intermediate Core Bond category, the American Beacon DoubleLine Select Income Fund (Y Class) was rated 5 stars out of 417 funds overall. The fund was rated 5 stars out of 417 funds; 5 stars out of 383 funds and 5 stars out of 285 funds for the three-, five- and 10-year periods, respectively.
